Findings, Table 2, Correlation Matrix: The table should include the sample size (N) for each correlation to provide context for the statistical significance.

Discussion, Paragraph 1, Sentence 1: The comparison with previous studies should be more specific. Mention the key findings of Abdollahi et al. (2021) and how they align or differ from the current study.

Discussion, Paragraph 2, Sentence 2: The term "marital dissatisfaction" needs further elaboration. Define what aspects of marital dissatisfaction were considered and their potential impact on remarriage desire.

Results, Paragraph 2, Sentence 1: The phrase "indicate that all direct paths in the final model are significant" is vague. Specify the criteria for significance (e.g., p < 0.05) and discuss the practical significance of these paths.

Discussion, Paragraph 4, Sentence 3: The statement "predictors of the level of self-differentiation include emotional reactivity" should be supported with references from the literature that discuss these predictors.

Limitations & Suggestions, Paragraph 1, Sentence 2: Explain why the reliance on self-report questionnaires is a limitation. Discuss potential biases and suggest alternative methods for future studies.
