1.1. Reviewer 1

Reviewer:

This paragraph reads more like a definition. Please add a stronger rationale at the end that explicitly highlights the research gap in Latin American adolescents.

- The research questions or hypotheses are implied but not explicitly stated. Please provide clear, testable hypotheses at the end of the introduction.
- The description of sampling is strong, but it would be useful to add how schools were selected (e.g., urban vs. rural, public vs. private). Without this, representativeness cannot be assessed.
- The measures section reports reliability from other studies but not Cronbach's alpha for the current sample. Please report internal consistency indices for all three scales in this study.
- Given that socio-economic status is highly relevant in Argentina, not measuring it is a limitation. Please acknowledge this explicitly in the limitations section.

1.2. Reviewer 2

Reviewer:

- This paragraph relies heavily on international studies. A critical gap remains: What prior evidence, if any, exists in Argentina or Latin America? This should be clarified.
- The discussion of intrinsic vs. extrinsic motivation is comprehensive, but the authors should better connect it to resilience. How exactly do different types of motivation predict resilience in prior studies?
- While several references are provided, they are listed sequentially. Consider synthesizing these studies by comparing findings rather than simply cataloguing them.
- The authors mention "numerous validation studies" but do not state whether Spanish-language validated versions of the AMS and ARS-30 were used. Please clarify translation/adaptation procedures.
 - This statistical threshold (p > .001) seems arbitrary. Please justify the cutoff chosen for multivariate outlier detection.
- This summary is helpful, but the discussion could be deepened by considering why grit mediates but does not fully explain the motivation—resilience link.
- Since gender distribution was balanced in the sample, it would strengthen the paper to at least conduct exploratory gender comparisons.
