1.1. Reviewer 1

Reviewer:

"For adolescents with physical disabilities friendships can offer a buffer against the negative effects of social isolation and stigma." - Provide a citation to support this claim or discuss relevant studies in more detail.

"However physical disabilities can hinder social interactions and the formation of friendships." - Elaborate on the specific ways physical disabilities can affect social interactions, possibly with examples or case studies.

"The inclusion criteria for participants are: a physical disability diagnosis the ability to understand and communicate in the language of the sessions and parental consent." - Clarify whether any specific types of physical disabilities were targeted or excluded.

"By understanding and appreciating the feelings of others adolescents can develop more supportive and compassionate relationships." - Provide examples or case studies from the literature to illustrate this process.

"The activities in drama therapy such as improvisation and storytelling require participants to articulate their thoughts and emotions clearly." - Include references or examples from previous studies that highlight the effectiveness of these activities.
