

1.1. Reviewer 1

Reviewer:

The paper provides a sound theoretical basis but could benefit from a more detailed integration of how these concepts have been linked in previous research, particularly in non-Western contexts.

The use of convenience sampling is justified; however, the paper would benefit from a more thorough discussion on the limitations of this approach and how it might affect the generalizability of the findings.

While the selected instruments are well-described, the low internal consistency for some personality traits (e.g., openness to experience) raises concerns about their reliability in this context. A discussion on the implications of these lower reliability scores for the study's findings is needed.

The paper effectively uses Pearson correlation and stepwise regression analysis. Still, a deeper explanation of the choice of stepwise regression over other potential multivariate techniques could provide clarity on the analysis strategy.



The results section is comprehensive, but the interpretation could be enhanced by discussing alternative explanations for the findings, especially considering cultural factors unique to Isfahan or Iran more broadly.
