1.1. Reviewer 1

Reviewer:

The manuscript mentions "Cinek, 2025" to assert the link between marital satisfaction and sexual function. This reference should be expanded upon to clarify the mechanisms or pathways by which this relationship manifests.

The inclusion criterion "Not taking psychiatric medications affecting sexual performance..." is appropriate, but it is unclear how this was verified. Was it based on self-report, medical records, or physician confirmation?

The psychometric properties of the Botlani et al. (2010) scale are briefly described. Consider specifying its construct validity or the factor structure to better justify its use.

The examples of distorted beliefs in CBCT (e.g., "I shouldn't enjoy this") are useful but would benefit from a citation linking these examples to empirical studies or validated belief inventories.

1.2. Reviewer 2

Reviewer:

The definition of sexual intimacy is presented with multiple dimensions. Consider condensing this explanation for clarity, or citing more recent integrative frameworks that operationalize these dimensions concisely.

The transition from general marital issues to systemic-behavioral and cognitive-behavioral therapies lacks cohesion. Consider adding a bridging sentence to guide the reader logically toward the therapeutic approaches studied.

Gender distribution is unbalanced (e.g., 93.3% male in control group). This skew should be acknowledged as a limitation, especially considering the use of FSFI, which assesses female sexual function.

The paper notes that systemic therapy helps partners "establish appropriate relational boundaries." While theoretically sound, empirical support from this study for this process is not presented. Consider qualifying this with "based on the intervention design" unless observational data supports it.
